Schedule of Events

Obedience

All the basic commands of sit, heel, down and retrieve will be tested here, not only in voice but hand signals as well. The teams will be marked on control and enthusiasm.

Agility

The dogs will have to master an agility course consisting of approximately ten obstacles including various heights of jumps, ramps, tires, and barrels. All the dogs will be unfamiliar with the course which makes it very interesting to watch.

Evidence Search

The dog team will have approximately ten minutes to locate a pre-determined number of articles ranging from as tiny as a shell casing to a balaclava concealed within an area cordoned off to simulate a crime scene.

Specialty Searches

This is also a timed event similar to the Evidence Search, where the teams must locate concealed quantities of explosives material or narcotics. The search areas will vary between vehicles, rooms, train cars and luggage.

Tracking

The dogs are required to complete a track of approximately one-half kilometre in length within a pre-determined amount of time. There will be a number of turns on the track and several articles along the way which the dogs must locate.

Building Search

Here we simulate a crime of a break-in to a night club. The dog and handler must search the building and locate all suspect(s) that are hidden within. The teams will be scored on their deployment techniques, officer safety and time.

Compound Search

Much like the building search, we simulate a break-in to a fenced compound. The suspect(s) will once again be hidden, and the team must search the compound and locate all the suspect(s). The teams will once again be scored on their deployment techniques, officer safety, and time.

Criminal Apprehension

This is, by far, the most enjoyable and entertaining spectator portion of the event. The teams are tested on their ability to apprehend suspects during simulated real action crimes complete with lights, sirens, and gunshots going off. The handlers will be scored on overall team performance and officer safety skills. This is non-stop action for the whole family.

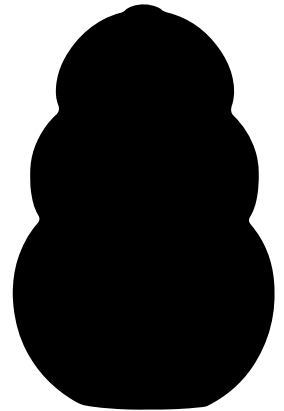

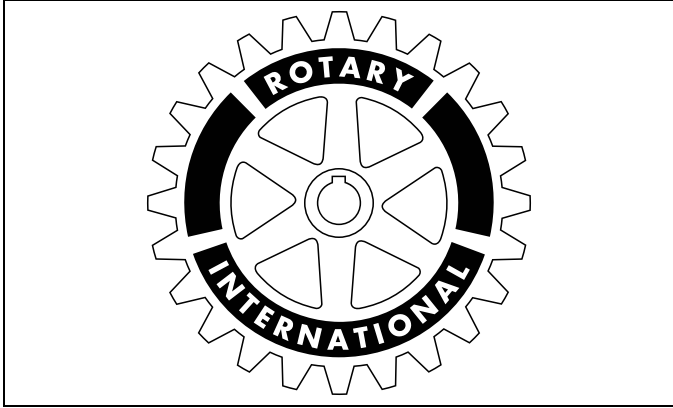
